JACQUELYN E. MILLER (JACQUIE)

Jacquelyn E. Miller (Jacquie) is a lawyer and writer living in ləkʷəŋən territory in Victoria. She founded Artemis Advocacy (artemisadvocacy.ca), a law practice serving Indigenous governing authorities, organizations, and individuals in Victoria and remotely across the province.

Before becoming a lawyer, Jacquie spent many years working in governance, intergovernmental relations, negotiations, and strategic advising. She has served in a variety of board roles, often in executive leadership capacities. She currently serves on the Victoria Bar Association as Treasurer and on its Governance Committee, and on the Canadian Bar Association-BC (CBABC) as Chair of the Women Lawyers Forum Vancouver Island Section and on the CBABC's Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Committee.

Jacquie holds a Juris Doctor and Juris Indigenarum Doctor and Master of Arts in Political Science and Cultural, Social and Political Thought from the University of Victoria, and a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and Philosophy from Simon Fraser University. She is exploring ideas for a PhD in legal history. Her writing includes "Camas Nullius?," a BC Studies article using miqəŋ / Beacon Hill Park to consider historic and ongoing land relations between Indigenous Peoples and settlers on the south Island. She is also co-writing a book on Indigenous knowledge, science, and shared ecological challenges.
